

Download + Install LibreOffice (Mac)

1) Check your Mac first

1. Click the **Apple menu** in the top-left.
 2. Click **About This Mac**.
 3. Make sure you have **enough storage** (at least **2 GB free** is a safe goal).
 4. Leave this window open if your teacher asks for your macOS version.

2) Go to the official LibreOffice website

1. Open **Safari** (or Chrome).
 2. In the address bar, navigate to https://www.libreoffice.org/download/download-libreoffice/?type=mac-x86_64&version=25.8.4&lang=en-US
-

3) Download the Mac installer

1. On the LibreOffice download page, make sure it shows **macOS**.
 2. Click **Download**.
 3. If your browser asks where to save it, choose **Downloads**.

4) Open the download

1. Open **Finder**.
 2. Click **Downloads** on the left.
 3. Look for a file that ends in **.dmg** (example: LibreOffice_..._MacOS_x86-64.dmg or ..._aarch64.dmg).
 4. Double-click the **.dmg** file to open it.

5) Install LibreOffice

1. A window will open showing the **LibreOffice** app.
2. **Drag** the **LibreOffice** icon into the **Applications** folder icon (in the same window).
3. Wait for it to finish copying.

6) Eject the installer

1. Open **Finder**.
2. On the left sidebar, find **LibreOffice** under “Locations.”
3. Click the **eject (⏏)** button next to it.

7) Open LibreOffice for the first time

1. Open **Finder** → **Applications**.
2. Find **LibreOffice**.
3. Double-click to open it.

If you get a security message like: “**LibreOffice can’t be opened because it is from an unidentified developer**”:

1. Click **Cancel**.
2. Go to **Apple menu** → **System Settings**.
3. Click **Privacy & Security**.
4. Scroll down to find a message about LibreOffice.
5. Click **Open Anyway** (then confirm).

8) Quick success check

1. LibreOffice should open its start center.
2. Click **Writer** and make sure a blank document opens.
3. Type your name and save it:
 - **File** → **Save As...**
 - Save to your **Documents** folder.
